Sometime ago, after a lot of thought, I came to the conclusion that one has to start somewhere in order to attempt to improve matters as far as possible and in this regard the thought of the most important international organisation in the world namely the United Nations has always been in the forefront of my mind.

Having studied the historical background of this international institution and its structure according to which they have to operate in the General Assembly and the Security Council in particular and with the ridiculous and unjust VETO right for five nations out of the 192 member states (America, Russia, China, England and France), I came to the conclusion that this organisation with its unlimited power and influence, specially by Veto right holders is not only most dictatorial but also simply hypocritical.
