To the newly elected secretary general of the United Nations Organization

Dear Mr. Guterres

To begin with may I congratulate you on your new appointment and wish you well in your future endeavors.

I have taken the liberty of writing to you as I have for years tried to suggest radical changes to the United Nations Organization's charter, and structure which I am sure you have already realized how dictatorial and hypocritical it is.

For the sake of brevity I suggest that you spend a few minutes of your valuable time to have a look at my site (www.democratiseun.org) to understand what our mission is all about and what steps I have taken so far.

As you are aware the voting system in existence according to the present rules, both in the general assembly and particularly in the security council, with the permanent membership of the five countries (U.S.A, Russia, China, France & UK) each of which have a veto right which makes the resolutions absolutely meaningless to the extent that some countries have in the past ignored those decisions and one or two member states have regarded them as worthless pieces of paper.

In closing I am absolutely sure that complete changes to the structure of the United Nations Organization will happen sooner rather than later and I have no doubt that if you start to make the appropriate suggestions, whatever the results, your name will be forever remembered by the majority of the population of the world with complete respect and admiration.

Finally I must let you know that I am a British citizen of Iranian origin and a Muslim by birth and I am 75 years old and therefore I am not in search of either fame or fortune.

And my efforts in this regard are purely on humanitarian grounds.
